On perusal of the record, it appears that in the year 2021, all these orders were passed by this Court on different dates. But till date, the said orders are not complied with by the respondents. 3. It is also an admitted fact that, a batch of writ appeals filed against the orders of the learned Single Judge were disposed of in the year 2023. Thereafter also, for the last two (02) years, the orders of the Court are not complied with. 4. It is unfortunate to note that during this month, while dealing with several contempt cases on the same subject matter, in around more than 50 cases, this Court ordered appearance of the concerned officers to present before this Court. Now, we have to issue Form-I notice to all the officers	Contd..

		impleaded in the present contempt cases also for not complying the orders of this Court. 5. On noticing the facts and circumstances of these cases and the conduct of the respondents, it appears that they are taking the Court proceedings and contempt proceedings in a very casual manner. 6. Learned counsel appearing for the respondents would submit that in some cases, the Panchayat Raj and Rural Development Department has to comply the orders and in some cases, the Finance Department has to comply the orders. 7. The view of this Court is that whatever the department it may be to comply the orders, they have to honour the Court orders and they have to implement the Court orders within the stipulated time. Failing which, it amounts to contempt. 8. Considering the fact that all these hundreds of contempt cases are pending for the last three (03) years before this Court, this Court intends to take a serious note of the conduct of the respondents and to pass appropriate orders against them under the provisions of the Contempt of Courts Act. Accordingly, Registry shall implead the following officers as respondents in C.C.No.943 and 1016 of 2022 by <i>suo moto</i> and issue notice to them. i. Mr. Shashi Bhushan Kumar, I.A.S., Principal Secretary, Panchayat Raj and Rural Development Department, Government of Andhra Pradesh. ii.
