No.2 of 2023</u> Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that false allegation was made against the petitioner/A.3 with omnibus, routine and general allegations, though	

		the petitioner has nothing with the family affairs of the de facto complainant since he is a lecturer working elsewhere and not residing with the de facto complainant and her husband. Learned Assistant Public Prosecutor has submitted that there is an allegation that the petitioner also harassed the de facto complainant along with other accused to bring additional dowry and the same is enough to constitute the offence for which the case is registered. It is further submitted that there are other allegations as well against the petitioner and it is premature to assess the allegations on the evidence available and it is not fit case for quashing at the stage of F.I.R. Perused the record. Since there is prima facie substance in the contention of the learned counsel for the petitioner, there shall be interim stay of all further proceedings in F.I.R. No.428 of 2022 dt.01.08.2022 of Krishnalanka P.S., for a period of two months, insofar as the petitioner is concerned. Post after summer vacation, 2023. B.S.BHANUMATHI, J BV	
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
