No.15202 of 2023</u> Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned Assistant Government Pleader for Revenue, who placed a copy of the written instructions dated 10.7.2023 received from the 4th respondent for perusal of this Court, wherein, while setting out the brief history with regard to the property in question and violations in respect of the same, it is stated at paragraph (x) as follows: <i>“Therefore, a notice has been issued to the petitioner calling for written explanation as why the existing unauthorized permanent structures shall not be removed and to resume the land to Government towards recovery of outstanding dues payable to the Township and the notice was also served to the petitioner by affixing the same in front of the subject property. But the petitioner has not turned up to submit his explanation. Hence, under inevitable circumstances a caution board has been erected over the subject matter property and the same is in accordance with law.”</i> Except mentioning that a notice has been issued, the details i.e., the date on which the same has been issued to the

		petitioner, the method of service etc., were not mentioned in the instructions. A copy of the so called notice is not enclosed to the instructions. This is yet another case wherein appropriate instructions to the learned Government Pleader are not furnished enable him to defend the actions of the respondent officials. Be that as it may. The matter requires consideration in the light of the averments made in the writ petition, which needs to be traversed by filing counters. In such view of the matter, the interim order granted on 27.6.2023 is extended until further orders. List the matter after four weeks, for filing counter. NJS, J <i>vasu</i>	
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
