Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India is filed praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to issue a writ, order or direction more particularly one in the nature of WRIT OF MANDAMUS declaring the action of respondents 2 to 4 in interfering with the petitioners' house sites admeasuring Ac.0.10 cents in Survey No.235-17 and 235-18 belonged to the petitioners 1 and 2 and Ac.0.12 cents in Survey No.313-4 belonged to the 3rd petitioner situated in Moduguvalasa R and R Colony Village at Chinna Kollivasa, L.N.Peta Mandal, Srikakulam District, without following due process of law as illegal, irregular, irrational, violative of principles of natural justice, and offends Articles 14, 21 and 300-A of Constitution of India and consequently direct the respondents not to interfere with the peaceful possession and enjoyment of petitioners said house sites.

IA NO: 1 OF 2023:

Petition under Section 151 of CPC is filed praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed in support of the petition, the High Court may be pleased to direct the respondents not to interfere with the peaceful possession and enjoyment of petitioners' house sites admeasuring Ac.0.10 cents in Survey No.235-17 and 235-18 belonged to the petitioners 1 and 2 and Ac.0.12 cents in Survey No.313-4 belonged to the 3rd petitioner situated in Moduguvalasa R and R Colony Village at Chinna Kollivasa, L.N.Peta Mandal, Srikakulam District, Pending disposal of WP 18809 of 2023, on the file of the High Court.

The petition coming on for hearing, upon perusing the Petition and the affidavit filed in support thereof and upon hearing the arguments of Sri SRINIVAS AMBATI Advocate for the Petitioners and of GP FOR REVENUE for the Respondent Nos.1 to 3, the Court made the following
