Petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India is filed praying that in the circumstances stated in the affidavit filed therewith, the High Court may be pleased to pass an Order to Issue a Writ or Order or Direction more particularly in the Nature of a Writ of Mandamus declaring the action of the respondents Police particularly the 3rd and 4th Respondents trying to Interfere into the Petitioners Possession and Enjoyment of the Property in an extent of 0-57 cents situated at Survey No.293/19 of Anandapuram Revenue Village, Anandapuram Mandal, Visakhapatnam District by Utilizing their Own Police Power, Influence even without have any right nor Jurisdiction there by exceeding their powers, limits on that Calling the Petitioners continuously to the Police Station unlawfully, illegally without have any case nor issuance of summons by violation of Articles 14,19,21, 300-A-of the Constitution of India, violation of police standing orders Consequently to direct the respondents 3 & 4 not to interfere into the Civil Disputes i.e., petitioner property in an extent of 0-57 cents situated at Survey No.293/19 of Anandapuram Revenue Village, Anandapuram Mandal, Visakhapatnam District nor question the rights of the property nor possession by any means or what so ever.
