ORDER:

This Writ Petition is filed under Article 226 of Constitution of India with the following prayer for:

“...to to Issue a Writ or Order or Direction more particularly in the Nature of a Writ of Mandamus declaring the actoin of the respondents Police particularly the 3rd and 4th Respondents trying to Interfere into the Petitioners Possessoion and Enjoymnet of the Property in an extent of 0-57 cents situated at Survey No.293/19 of Anandapuram Revenue Village , Anandapuram Mandal, Visakhpatnam District by Utilisng their Own Police Power, Influence even without have any right nor Jurisdiction there by exceeding ther powers , limits on that Calling the Petitioners continuously to the Police Station unlawfully, illegally without have any case nor issuance of summons by violation of Article 14,19,21, 300-A-of the Consitutoin of India , violation of police standing orders Consequeetnly to direct the respondents 3 AND 4 not to interfere into the Civil Disputes i.e., petitoiner property in an extent of 0-57 cents situated at Survey No.293/19 of Anandapuram Revenue Village , Anandapuram Mandal, Visakhpatnam District nor question the rights of the property nor possessoion by any means or what so ever and to pass...”

2. Heard Sri R.Siva Sai Swarup, learned counsel for the petitioners and Sri V.Farooq, learned Assistant Government Pleader for Home.

3. When the matter is taken up for hearing, Sri V.Farooq, learned Assistant Government Pleader for Home, on written instructions would submit that, the police never interfered into the petitioners possession and enjoyment of the property and never threatened the petitioner to settle the civil disputes between the petitioner and unofficial respondent.

4. The learned counsel for the petitioners would submit that the Court may pass appropriate orders.

5. Considering the submissions made, the writ petition is disposed of. However, respondent-police are directed not to interfere in the civil disputes between the parties except under due process of law. There shall be no order as to costs.

As a sequel thereto, miscellaneous petitions pending, if any, shall stand closed.
