Order of The Tribunal

This Tribunal in its orders on 12.10.2021 had given a direction to the Central Board of Excise and Customs i.e the respondent no.2 to re-examine the matter of regularisation of services of the applicants in the O.A in the light of the facts and circumstances indicated in the letter dated 8.5.2019. It was also directed to file a fresh Compliance Report before this Tribunal specifying about the action which had been taken in this regard within a period of three months from the date of issue of a copy of that order. It was directed to indicate therein that whether the cases of the two applicants in these two O.As had been considered by the Board and what decision has been taken in their cases, in the light of the letter of the Board dated 8.5.2019.

Today, when the matter came up for consideration, the learned SCGSC has furnished a copy of a DoP&T letter addressed to the Department of Revenue dated 1.6.2022 in which it has been indicated that the matter had been examined and the DoP&T has not concurred with the proposal of the Administrative Ministry (AM) for the regularisation of services of casual labourers. The said letter refers to retrospective regularisation of 133 CL-TS of CBIC who had attained the age of superannuation before regularisation. However, the said letter does not explain what has happened in the cases of two applicants, herein, which were to be considered as directed by this Tribunal in order dated 12.10.2021.

The learned SCGSC may file a specific compliance report about the action taken by the Board in this case on the Order passed on 12.10.2021. List on 27.10.2022.

Issue a copy of this order to learned counsel for the parties.
