3. The petitioner vide the present petition under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 seeks quashing of FIR No.367/2015 dated 01.07.2015 registered under Sections 452/354/354A/308/34 IPC at P.S. Sadar Bazar, Delhi, and all proceeding emanating therefrom in view of the Compromise Deed dated 25.12.2022 entered into between the parties.

4. This petition is accompanied by the Compromise Deed dated 25.12.2022 [Annexure D] and is also supported by affidavits of the petitioner and of respondent nos.2 to 4, alongwith proofs of their respective I.Ds.

5. Petitioner as also respondent nos.2 to 4, are present in Court and have been identified by the IO. Their credentials have been verified by this Court.

6. Issue Notice.

7. Learned APP for the State accepts notice. He confirms that State has no objection to the quashing of the said FIR.

8. Respondent nos.2 to 4 affirms the Compromise Deed dated 25.12.2022 and submit that they have voluntarily settled all disputes with the petitioner and state that they do not wish to pursue the criminal proceedings against the petitioner and have no objection to the quashing of the present FIR.

9. In view of the fact that the settlement has been arrived at between the parties, and as respondent nos.2 to 4 do not wish to continue with the criminal proceedings, in order to bring a quietus to the present disputes and the law laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in *Gian Singh vs. State of Punjab & Anr.* (2012) 10 SCC 303 and *Narinder Singh & Ors. vs. State of Punjab & Anr.* (2014) 6 SCC 466, this Court is of the opinion that continuation of the aforesaid FIR will be an exercise in futility.

10. Accordingly, the petition is allowed and FIR No.367/2015 dated 01.07.2015 registered under Sections 452/354/354A/308/34 IPC at P.S. Sadar Bazar, Delhi, and all proceeding emanating therefrom are quashed,
