Case called out.

Plaintiff and Defendant No. 1 to 5 are present. Their respective counsels are present. After long conciliation, both the parties have agreed to settle the matter amicably. Both of them have filed Compromise petition U/o. 23 Rule 3 of CPC seeking leave of the court to compromise the matter. Contents of the compromise petition are read over and explained to the parties in the language known to them.

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They state that they have entered into compromise out of their own will and wish, without any coercion and force and agreed to compromise and prays to decree the suit as per compromise petition.

Both the parties are identified by their respective counsels.

On perusal of terms of compromise, they appear to be fair and legal. Hence there is no impediment in accepting compromise petition.

Therefore, I proceed to pass the following:

ORDER.

Compromise petition filed U/o. 23 Rule 3 of CPC by the both the parties is hereby allowed.

Suit is disposed of as compromise before Lok-Adalath.

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It is also made clear that compromise petition forms part of the decree.

Draw final decree accordingly in terms of compromise petition.
