1. The present interlocutory application has been filed on behalf of the appellants for grant of ad-interim bail during the pendency of this appeal.
2. Heard learned counsel for the appellants and learned counsel for the State.
3. The appellants have been convicted for the offence under Sections 147, 342/149, 323/149, 332/149, 353/149 & 120-B of the Indian Penal Code and have been maximum sentenced to undergo simple imprisonment for six months by the learned Additional Judicial Commissioner-VII-cum-Special Judge CBI (AHD), Ranchi in connection with Barkagaon P.S. Case No.135 of 2016 corresponding to G.R. No.1427 of 2016.
4. It has been submitted by the learned counsel for the appellants that the appellants are in custody in other case. Their custody is long. In the present case, they have been convicted for only six months. On the above basis, the prayer for bail has been made.
5. On the other hand, learned counsel for the State has opposed the prayer for bail.
6. Considering the fact that they have been convicted only for six months, the appellants named above, are directed to be released on bail, on their furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) each with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned Additional Judicial Commissioner-VII-cum-Special Judge CBI (AHD), Ranchi in connection with Barkagaon P.S. Case No.135 of 2016 corresponding to G.R. No.1427 of 2016, subject to the condition that the appellants will submit their mobile number before the learned court below which they will always keep active and will not change it during pendency of this case without prior permission of the court.
7. In the result, the present interlocutory application being I.A. No.6823 of 2022 stands allowed.
