This bail application has been filed on behalf of the abovenamed applicant with prayer to release on bail in connection with Devipur P.S. Case No.10 of 2022 registered under Sections 25(1-B)a, 25(1-A), 26, 35, 31 of the Arms Act pending in the court of learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Deoghar.

Learned counsel for the applicant has submitted that the F.I.R. of this case was lodged against five named accused including the applicant with the allegations that the informant—police officer along with police force had carried out raid after having received the informant that some miscreants were planning to commit dacoity and five persons including the applicant were apprehended at the spot. From possession of the applicant one country made pistol is alleged to be recovered.

Learned counsel for the applicant has submitted that the applicant is innocent and has been falsely implicated in this case. It is further submitted that the alleged recovery of country made pistol has been planted and there is no independent witness of the seizure memo. The applicant was not involved in plan of committing dacoity as alleged and he has been languishing in jail since 07.02.2022.

Learned A.P.P. appearing on behalf of the State vehemently opposed the contentions made by the learned counsel for the applicant and contended that applicant is having criminal antecedent.

In view of the submissions made and materials on record, the bail application of the applicant is hereby allowed. Let the applicant be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.20,000/-(Rupees Twenty Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount to the satisfaction of the court concerned in aforesaid case.
