Heard Mr. P.Shome, learned counsel for the petitioner who filed and moved a bail application and submits that the accused, Shri. Eiborlang Tlang is an innocent man and has nothing to do with the truck or coal which was detained by the police. He was a mere passerby and was no way involved in this case and police unnecessarily arrested him just to harass him for the reasons best known to them.

In reply to the submission advanced by the learned counsel for the petitioner, Mr. K.Khan, learned Addl. Sr. State counsel strongly objected the bail application and submits that the truck was moving in a wrong lane endangering the life and property of the people and it is also a fact that the whole intention to move in the wrong lane was just to avoid to pay tax/royalty for the coal. He also submits that petitioner is very much involved and investigation is going on and it is too premature to consider the bail application. He also produced the CD before the Court.

CD perused.

After hearing the submissions advanced by the learned counsels for the parties and considering the materials on record, I am of the view that there is no reason to record that petitioner is in no way involved in the case. Therefore, to grant bail at this stage may hamper the investigation. After completion of the investigation, petitioner may move for a regular bail before the lower court concerned.

With this observation and direction, the bail application is rejected and stands disposed of.
