4. The petitioners/their representatives shall remain present in the office of respondent No. 2 along with copy of this order and copy of their representation at 11 AM on 28-09-2020 in order to enable respondent No. 2 to comply with this order effectively.

5. Accordingly, writ petitions stand disposed of.
