ORDER

1. The inspection report filed by the Karnataka State Pollution Control Board is taken on record. Though the report has stated that the treated water is stored in a collection tank of 1000 Litres capacity mixed with the fresh water and the washed water was flowing all around.
2. The report is silent about whether the appellant unit which is engaged in business of service station requires consent from the Karnataka State Pollution Control Board and if so, under which provision of law.
3. The learned counsel appearing for the Karnataka State Pollution Control Board also mentioned that the recent inspection shows that the appellant company is fully in compliance of all the norms. If that is so, let the Karnataka State Pollution Control Board file an additional report to that effect along with the other required details.
4. Post the matter on **01.02.2024**.
