

In paragraph 15 of the writ petition, it has been stated that the petitioner made representations after representations before the respondents with the request to pay his arrear salary by granting increments in the pay scale, in the pre-revised salary as well as the payment of arrear salary which fell due as a consequence of revision of pay scale and also increments in the revised pay scale but such representations have not been disposed of. It appears that the representation had been addressed to the Chief Secretary and that also has not been done through the proper channel. A Government employee cannot approach the superior authority directly by-passing the immediate authority, that is, the Secretary of the Department. Therefore, there is no merit in the writ petition. At this stage, Mr. S.K. Home Choudhury, learned counsel for the petitioner wants to withdraw from the writ petition.</p>
