O R D E R

Heard learned counsel for the petitioner.

We do not find any grounds to interfere with the judgment and  
order of the High Court rejecting the application of the petitioner  
under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure. It cannot be  
said that the allegations against the petitioner do not disclose  
any offence. Whether the allegations are correct or not, has to be  
decided at an appropriate stage.

Needless to mention that the petitioner may apply for discharge and any such application shall be decided in accordance with law. It is axiomatic that any observation made in the judgment impugned will not affect future proceedings.

Mr. R. Basant, learned senior counsel submits that the disputes between the parties, which are matrimonial, may be referred to mediation. It will be open to the petitioner to approach the Trial Court for reference of the disputes to mediation.
