O R D E R

The contemnors have deposited the demand drafts in terms of liberty given by this Court vide order dated 15.11.2021.

If the amount has been realized, it is open to the petitioner to withdraw the same, including other amounts and interest accrued thereon lying in the registry in connection with this case.

A formal application in that behalf be made by the petitioner, which can be considered appropriately.

Considering the fact that the directions stand complied with, we dispose of this proceeding by reiterating the observations made in order dated 20.11.2020 that the fact that the contemnors

have vacated the premises pursuant to the directions given by this Court will not absolve them from paying compensation amount as may be determined by the authority concerned, owing to unauthorizedly overstaying in the premises in question.

The contempt petitions are disposed of accordingly.
