O R D E R

Having regard to the nature of order we are proposing to pass, we are not issuing notice to the respondent.

The petitioner herein was granted bail in FIR No.715 of 2015 which was registered against him under Section 498-A of the Indian Penal Code as well as under Sections 3 and 4 of the Dowry Prohibition Act. This bail was given with the condition that the petitioner shall appear before the IX Metropolitan Magistrate, Cyberabad, Kukatpally, on first

Monday of every month for a period of six months subject to further orders. This is the condition imposed by the High Court vide impugned order dated 28.02.2017.

The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is having his job in London and it would be very difficult for him to come to the Court of the Magistrate every Monday of every month for this purpose. In order to show his *bona fides*, the petitioner submits that he is ready to appear before the Magistrate once in every two months, i.e., first Monday of June, 2017, and first Monday of August, 2017. This is a reasonable request of the petitioner. The aforesaid prayer is allowed and the order of the High Court is modified to that extent.

This order shall not preclude the Magistrate to impose any further condition(s).

In case the respondent-complainant has any objection, she will be at liberty to approach this Court.

With these observations, the special leave petition is disposed of.
