

have not been impleaded as parties. Secondly, the petitioner claims to be a registered proprietorship firm and in support thereof, it has filed a document which is annexed at Page No. 65, which is merely a business registration number under the Shops and Commercial Establishments Act, issued by the Directorate of Economics and Statistics, Rajasthan.

From the reading of the entire petition, we do not find that the petitioner has any direct interest in the matter and, thus, we are of the clear opinion that the petitioner has no locus to maintain this petition. The petitioner, who claims itself to be an educational consultant is, in our view, a mere facilitator for getting the admission of students in foreign universities for MBBS course.

We, thus, dismiss this petition with a cost of Rs. 25,000/-, which shall be deposited by the petitioner with the Registry of this Court within one month from today. The amount so deposited shall be credited to the account of the Supreme Court Employees Mutual Welfare Fund. In case, the petitioner does not deposit the said amount, the Registry shall require the District Magistrate of Bhilwara, Rajasthan to recover the same from the petitioner as arrears of land revenue and deposit the same in the Registry of this Court.

Pending application(s), if any, stands disposed of accordingly.
