O R D E R

We are informed that the final order has been passed thus this special leave petition has become infructuous. However, it is pointed out by the learned counsel for the petitioner that the

interim protection was granted by this Court on 5th June, 2017 and while issuing directions in the main matter, interim protection has not been specifically granted by the High Court. The final order has been produced before us.

The final order dated 16th January, 2018 leaves it to the trial court to consider the allegations made in the complaint.

We are, therefore, of the view that till the trial court examines the matter, the interim protection granted on 5th June, 2017 should continue to enure for the benefit to the petitioners but the same shall not, in any manner, affect the order to be passed in the matter.
