Having heard Mr. Rakesh Kumar, learned counsel for the
petitioner and Ms. Pratishtha Vij, learned counsel for the
respondent-State of Bihar, who presented the case with clarity, we
find that since co-accused No.6, who is the alleged purchaser of
the weapon in question, has already been granted bail by the High
Court, the petitioner, who is an alleged intermediary, ought to
have been granted bail. Consequently, the High Court order is set
aside and the petitioner is released on bail, subject to the usual
conditions to be imposed by the trial Court.
