The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is in jail since 03.03.2019. In the facts and circumstances of the case, we are convinced that the petitioner is entitled for release on bail at this stage as there is no likelihood of the trial being completed soon. Moreover, the material witnesses have been examined and the petitioner has been in jail since 3.3.2019.

The petitioner is directed to be released on bail subject to the satisfaction of the trial court.
