

the fact that pursuant to the impugned interim order dated 17.08.2020 having resulted in the 96 students having gone through various rounds of counselling by 31.08.2020, we decline to interfere with the interim order under Article 136 of the Constitution of India.

However, we make it clear that the final hearing of the writ petition is to take place within three weeks from today and judgment delivered within another two weeks thereafter so that the students are not left hanging in uncertainty. We also make it clear that in case the learned Single Judge, who is assigned to decide this case, finally decides it against the students, the students can claim no equity whatsoever. We also make it clear that the pleadings are to be completed before the learned Single Judge within a period of ten days from today. The learned Chief Justice of the High Court may look into this matter to see that the time-lines indicated by our order are strictly adhered to.

The special leave petition is disposed of accordingly.

Pending application stands disposed of.
