O R D E R

The husband has come up with these three transfer petitions seeking transfer of (1) Case No.944 of 2018 titled as Pallavi Garg vs. Manish Choudhary pending before the court of ACJM-5, Court, Agra, Uttar Pradesh; (2) Case No.51952 of 2019 titled as State vs. Manish Kumar Choudhary & Etc. pending before the court of Chief Judicial Magistrate, Agra, Uttar Pradesh; and (3) Case No.1682 of 2018 titled as Pallavi Garg vs. Manish Choudhary pending before the court of ACJM-12, Courts, Agra, Uttar Pradesh to the court of competent jurisdiction in Patiala House Courts, New Delhi.

Heard Mr. Jitender Chaudhary, learned counsel for the petitioner and Mr. Pankaj Yadav, learned counsel for the respondent.

Admittedly, there was already a Transfer Petition being Transfer Petition (C) No. 138/2019 between the same parties, in which this Court passed an order transferring a case to a neutral place, namely the Courts in Patiala House, New Delhi.

Therefore, it is better that all the cases are transferred to the same place. Hence, these three transfer petitions, namely, (1) Case No.944 of 2018 titled as Pallavi Garg vs. Manish Choudhary pending before the court of ACJM-5, Court, Agra, Uttar Pradesh; (2) Case No.51952 of 2019 titled as State vs. Manish Kumar Choudhary & Etc. pending before the court of Chief Judicial Magistrate, Agra, Uttar Pradesh; and (3) Case No.1682 of 2018 titled as Pallavi Garg vs. Manish Choudhary pending before the court of ACJM-12, Courts, Agra, Uttar Pradesh are transferred to the court of competent jurisdiction in Patiala House Courts, New Delhi. The husband shall bear the expenses of the wife for travel to Delhi, which I quantify at Rs.5,000/- for every day of hearing whenever she appears.

Let the records of the case be transferred to the concerned court without delay.

The Transfer Petitions are allowed accordingly.
