UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following
O R D E R

By this Court's order dated 24.10.2017, the matter was referred to the Supreme Court Mediation Centre to explore the possibility of an amicable settlement between the parties. There, the parties have settled their disputes gracefully. A Deed of Settlement duly signed by the parties and their respective advocate

on 25.10.2017, has been placed on record.

Hence, we dispose of this special leave petition in terms of the aforesaid Deed of Settlement which shall form part of this order.

However, having heard learned counsel appearing for the parties and in the interests of justice, we direct that in paragraph 1(a) of the aforesaid Deed of Settlement, instead of phrase "expressing to that she is regretted for the above publication" shall be substituted by the phrase "expressing to that the above publication was unfortunately published in Ananda Bazar Partika." We further add that the above publication shall be made as prominently as the disputed publication. Further, in paragraph 1(a) of the said Deed of Settlement, the words "within 7 days" shall be read as the words "within 21 days".

The parties are also given liberty to correct any typographical error/s in the aforesaid Deed of Settlement with mutual consent.

As a sequel to the above, pending interlocutory applications, if any, stand disposed of.
