O R D E R

These Special Leave Petitions are directed against an order dated 17.08.2021 passed in C.M.A. No.314 of 2021 by which the order passed by the trial

Court was reversed by the High court and the trial Court was directed to dispose of the Interlocutory application afresh. Status quo was ordered till the disposal of the interlocutory application by the trial Court.

Mr.K.V.Vishwanathan, learned senior counsel appearing for the petitioners submitted that the interim order of status quo passed by the High Court is qualitatively different from the status quo that was passed by this court in the earlier round of litigation.

We refrain from entering into the merits of other contentions made by Mr.Vishwanathan, learned senior counsel as the Special Leave Petitions are filed against an application which is interlocutory in nature. The Special Leave Petitions are accordingly, dismissed. Pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of.

The trial Court is directed to dispose of the Interlocutory Application No.59 of 2021 in O.S.No.13 of 2021 within a period of two weeks without being influenced by the observations made by the High Court.

We make it clear that we have not expressed any opinion on the merits of the matters. The parties are at liberty to raise all contentions.
