

We also posed a query to learned counsel for the petitioner on the basis of the averment contained in the original petition filed before the National Green Tribunal wherein the petitioner before us has stated that he is "one of the younger members of the family which is running the respondent No.3 unit" i.e. the unit against which complaint was made. On a further query, whether the branches of family are in the dispute, learned counsel on instructions states that the dispute is between his uncle and father and he is not directly involved.

We refuse to interfere with the impugned order on two accounts:

- 1) The order passed is an interim order and for that reason alone we are not inclined to interfere with the impugned order under Article 136 of the Constitution of India, more so, when the matter is being considered.
- 2) It is obvious to us that the proceedings before the National Green Tribunal flow from a family dispute and the son is being used by the father for purposes of settling business rivalry.

The Special Leave Petition is, accordingly, dismissed.
