



Ms. Vibha Datta Makhija, learned Senior Advocate for the petitioners relied upon the directions issued by this Court in Alok Kumar Singh & Others vs. State of U.P. & Others [(2019) 14 SCC 692] and more particularly direction (A) which was as under:

"In the peculiar fact situation of the present case, as a one time exception, we issue following directions:

A) 607 posts lying vacant as a result of certain candidates having discontinued training or having failed to qualify in medical examination/character verification, shall be offered and made available in the present selection itself, strictly in order of merit and subject to fulfilment of having obtained 50% or more marks."

Ms. Makhija, learned Senior Advocate also invited our attention to Notification dated 20.09.2019 which declared results in respect of 685 posts of Sub Inspector Civil Police and 84 posts of Platoon Commander PAC. She submitted that there were still some vacancies and, therefore, State be directed to fill up those vacancies.

The instant selection process for the recruitment of Sub-Inspector Civil Police, was initiated in the year 2011, which is why the order dated 27.11.2018, itself was passed as "one time exception".

Even if there are unfilled vacant seats, in our view, at this length of time, it will not be proper to keep issuing directions to fill them up from the same selection. The

vacancies, if any, must now ensure to the advantage of the next selection process.

Consequently, we see no merit in this petition. The Writ Petition is dismissed.

Pending applications, if any, shall stand disposed of.
