ORDER

Heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the record.

In furtherance to the previous Order dated 09.09.2021, the matter was referred to the Supreme Court Mediation Centre. By way of settlement agreement a letter has been received from the Supreme Court Mediation Centre and the learned counsel present on behalf of the parties stated across the bar that a sum of Rs. 10,00,000/- (Rupees Ten Lakhs Only) and jewellery has been returned back to the petitioner-wife by the respondent-husband. It is further agreed that after the withdrawal of other proceedings pending in the concerned Courts, the remaining amount of Rs. 5,00,000/- (Rupees Five Lakhs Only) shall be paid by the respondent-husband to the petitioner-wife within a period not later than two weeks from the date of disposal of those proceedings.

It is requested by the learned counsel for the parties that in terms of the said settlement agreement and in view of the above,

exercising the power under Article 142 of the Constitution of India, the decree of divorce by mutual consent may be directed.

Considering the report of the Supreme Court Mediation Centre and the terms as specified therein as agreed by the parties, it is directed that the cases be treated as disposed of as per the terms of settlement.

The decree of divorce by mutual consent is directed, as prayed by the parties. It is also directed that if the parties make request for dropping the proceedings in the concerned Courts it will be acceded by the Court without going into the technicalities.

The respondent-husband shall pay the remaining amount of Rs. 5,00,000/- (Rupees Five Lakhs Only) within the period of two weeks from the date of disposal of the proceedings in the Courts below otherwise, it will be treated as non compliance to the Order of this Court.

With the aforesaid observations, these transfer petitions are disposed of.
