O R D E R

This Special Leave Petition challenges the order dated 11.09.2020 passed by the High Court of Kerala at Ernakulam in Criminal Revision Petition No.204 of 2007, whereby the order of conviction and sentence recorded against the present petitioner in respect of the offences punishable under Sections 406, 409 and 477A IPC in C.C. No.250/2000 stood confirmed.

We have heard Mr. Karthik S.D., learned Advocate in support of the petition.

We do not see any reason to interfere in the matter. The Special Leave Petition is, therefore, dismissed.

It must be stated that by virtue of order dated 20.11.2020 passed by the learned Chamber Judge of this Court, the petitioner was granted exemption from surrendering. Now that the Special Leave Petition is dismissed and the order of conviction and sentence stands confirmed, we grant two weeks' time to the petitioner to surrender before the concerned Police Station so that the remaining part of the sentence can be undergone.

In case the petitioner does not surrender within the time specified, the concerned police shall be at liberty to take the petitioner in custody.

A copy of this order be sent to the concerned Police Station and the jurisdictional Chief Judicial Magistrate for compliance.

Pending applications, if any, also stand disposed of.
