

Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961. Investigation has been completed and chargesheet has been filed under Section 306, 498-A, 34 of IPC. It is alleged in the chargesheet that petitioner along with her husband and her two sons were harassing the deceased for dowry of Rs.2,00,000/- and also for giving birth to three girls. Unable to bear the torture, the deceased consumed Eco Milk Chemical and died.

The Learned Counsel for the Petitioner submitted that her son, Sudhir Singh was living separately with the deceased since 2013. It has been stated that petitioner has been falsely implicated. The husband of the petitioner against whom similar allegations have been given the benefit of anticipatory bail. The learned counsel for the State relying upon counter affidavit filed in this Court argued that the deceased committing suicide when she has a child who is one month old is highly improbable. It was argued on behalf of the State that the petitioner is not entitled for any relief in view of the allegations made in the chargesheet relating to harassment of the deceased.

Investigation has been completed and chargesheet has been filed and there is no need for any custodial interrogation of the petitioner. The husband of the petitioner has been granted anticipatory bail. There is no denial to the averment

of the petitioner that the deceased was living separately with her husband since 2013.

In the facts and circumstances of the case, the petitioner is directed to be released in the event of her arrest in Crime No.498 of 2020, registered at Police Station Porsa, District Morena, M.P.

The Special Leave Petition is accordingly, disposed of. Pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of.
