Mr. Renjith B., learned counsel appearing for the petitioner, has submitted that the charge-sheet has been filed against the petitioner who is second accused. He has further submitted that petitioner-accused has learnt that first accused-Abdulazeez Abdulsathar is under "Travel Ban" etc. by the Supreme Judiciary Council, State of Qatar, and the presence of the said accused is not possible, which should not prejudice the petitioner to seek bail.

Having regard to the submissions made at the Bar, this special leave petition is disposed of giving liberty to the petitioner to approach the concerned Sessions Court seeking bail afresh. As and when such an application for bail is filed by the petitioner, learned Sessions Court shall consider and decide the same on its own merit without being influenced by the view expressed by the High Court.

Pending applications, if any, shall also stand disposed of.
