O R D E R

1. On 6.7.2021 this Court had passed the following order:-

"Heard learned senior counsel for the petitioner.

Taking into consideration the peculiar facts and circumstances of this case, we are not inclined to entertain these petitions.

The special leave petitions are, accordingly, dismissed.

However, the question of law is left open to be decided in an appropriate case.

However, to satisfy ourselves about the welfare of the daughter of Respondent Nos. 3 and 4, we direct the Registrar of the High Court of Kerala at Ernakulam to take steps to produce the girl before the concerned District Judge after one month and the learned District Judge is directed to interact with the girl and her parents, and ascertain the well-being of the girl, and send a report to this Court in that regard.

As a sequel to dismissal of the special leave petitions, pending interlocutory application also stands disposed of."

2. In compliance with the above order, the Principal District & Sessions Judge, Alappuzha, Kerala vide letter dated 10-8-2021, has informed that a meeting was held on 9-8-2021 at 10.30 a.m. and he has interacted with both, the girl and the parents individually.

3. As per the said letter, the girl is enrolled in a B.Tech course in Electronics and she is attending classes online. She seemed happy and comfortable with her parents.

4. In view of the above letter, we are satisfied that the girl's welfare has been taken care of.

5. Miscellaneous applications stand disposed of.
