O R D E R

After filing of the transfer petition, the parties have settled their disputes before the Supreme Court Mediation Centre and entered into a settlement agreement dated 14.12.2021 which is placed before this Court.

Today, we have heard learned counsel for the parties and also have heard the parties. The parties agreed that they have entered into a settlement and they seek dissolution of marriage in terms of power under Article 142 of the Constitution of India. Under the circumstances, we dispose of the transfer petitions in the following manner:

- (1) The marriage between the petitioner and the respondent will stand dissolved.
- (2) The terms of the settlement agreement dated 14.12.2021 will form part of the decree.

(3) The parties will abide by the terms of the settlement agreement.

We record the submission of the learned counsel for the petitioner that the petitioner will forward the telephone numbers of the petitioner to the learned counsel for the respondent today, so that visitation right of the child, the custody of whom is made over to the petitioner under the settlement terms, is facilitated.

The FIR No. 320/2020 before the police station Bhagwan Bazaar, Saran, Bihar will stand quashed. As far as the other cases are concerned, it is for the parties to do the needful to withdraw or get quashed the said cases.

The transfer petitions are disposed of in the aforesaid manner.
