



respect of the charge sheet and any further action that may be pursued are kept open.

3 Besides the above, the Court has also been apprised of the fact that an arbitral award was rendered by the sole arbitrator on 29 February 2020.

4 Mr Siddharth Dave states that the petitioners are in the process of taking recourse to the remedies which are available under Section 34 of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996.

5 Since the charge sheet has been submitted, we are, in the facts and circumstances of the present case, not inclined to entertain the Special Leave Petition under Article 136 of the Constitution. However, we clarify that all the rights and remedies of the parties in law are kept open.

6 Subject to the aforesaid, the Special Leave Petition is dismissed.

7 The *ad-interim* protection that was granted by the order of this Court dated 3 February 2020 shall continue for a period of three weeks expiring on 7 December 2020 so as to enable the petitioners to pursue the remedies which are available in law.

8 Pending application stands disposed of.
