O R D E R

- 1) We have heard the learned counsel appearing for the parties.
- 2) At the joint request made by the learned counsel for the parties, we, on 9-2-2018, directed the parties to appear before the Supreme Court Mediation Centre on 12th February, 2018 at 11.00 a.m.
- 3) It is stated that the parties have amicably settled all their disputes in terms of the settlement agreement dated 17-3-2018 arrived at between them and they have filed a joint application under Article 142 of the Constitution of India seeking exercise of extraordinary powers for grant of divorce by mutual consent.
- 4) Mr. Arvind Gupta (husband) and Ms. Divya Ohri (wife) are present before the Court. Both of them agreed before us for grant of divorce by mutual consent.
- 5) Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner (husband) has handed over a Demand Draft bearing No.550849 dated 16-3-2018 amounting to Rs.49000000/- (Rupees Four Crore Ninety Lakhs) drawn in favour of wife to the learned counsel appearing for the respondent (wife) in the Court today.
- 6) We have been told that the parties are living separately since June, 2016 and they have not been able to live together and they

mutually agreed that the marriage should be dissolved by this Court.

7) Having regard to the peculiar facts and circumstances of the case in question and to do complete justice to the parties, we are of the view that it is a fit case to invoke our jurisdiction under Article 142 of the Constitution of India and grant a decree of divorce by mutual consent.

8) Accordingly, the marriage between Mr. Arvind Gupta (husband) and Ms. Divya Ohri (wife) stands dissolved by decree of mutual consent.

9) The terms of Settlement shall form part of the decree.

10) Parties are directed to abide by the terms and conditions contained in the Settlement Agreement dated 17-3-2018 without fail.

11) The Special Leave Petition is disposed of in the afore-stated terms.
