O R D E R

Heard.

We find that the eviction petition initiated in the year 2001 is still pending. When an amendment was sought to be made by the tenant, the petitioner-landlord opposed. The objection was upheld by the Trial Court and the same was reversed by the High

Court. Pendency of the case before this Court would only further delay the disposal of the eviction petition filed in 2001.

Therefore, we are of the view that it is in the interest of the petitioner that this Special Leave Petition is disposed of with the following direction:

We direct that the Civil Judge (Senior Division), Dausa, Rajasthan, where the eviction petition is pending, to dispose of the same expeditiously at any rate within six months from the date of the production of a copy of the this order. Needless to say, the Trial Court shall make appropriate arrangements to complete the pleadings and dispose of the case on merits.

Pending applications, if any, shall stand disposed of.
