Leave granted.

In the course of hearing, a suggestion was given to Mr. P.B. Suresh, learned counsel appearing for the appellants whether the claim shall stand satisfied if the appellants are paid a total sum of Rs.17,50,000/- (Rupees seventeen lacs fifty thousand only). Learned counsel accepted the same. Mr. Harsh Kumar, learned counsel appearing for the insurer, left it to the discretion of the Court.

In view of the aforesaid, it is directed that the insurer shall deposit an amount of Rs.17,50,000/- (Rupees seventeen lacs fifty thousand only) before the Tribunal within twelve weeks hence failing which it shall carry interest at the rate of 9% per annum from the date of application before the Tribunal. The amount deposited shall be disbursed in favour of the appellants on proper identification .

In view of the above, the appeal stands disposed of. There shall be no order as to costs.
