UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following

O R D E R

Respondent No.107, The Fertilizers and Chemicals  
Tranvancore Ltd. Company furnished the Revised scheme on  
14.01.2022 and the petitioner, after examination, has  
given approval on 07.02.2022 for implementation of the

scheme for making payments of pay revision arrears from 01.01.1997 to 30.06.2001.

A perusal of the affidavit also shows that the arrears are to be disbursed in three installments with the first installment preferably being disbursed in the present financial year itself. Learned counsel for the respondent No.107 submits that this would be adhered to and the first installment will be disbursed in this financial year itself.

Learned counsel for the private respondents state that they should not be called upon to file an affidavit before disbursing the amount to the effect that they will not claim any interest and the aspect of interest should be left to the parties to claim in civil proceedings, if they so desire.

We have to appreciate that the endeavour has been to meet the liabilities of the company which has been in difficulty and the respondents/employees will have to accept the scheme as formulated.

In view of the aforesaid, we close the present proceedings in terms of the claim which has been now approved.

The Special Leave Petitions accordingly stand disposed of.

Pending application, if any, stands disposed of.
