O R D E R

Heard Ms. Aruna Gupta, learned counsel for the husband and Ms. Neela Gokhale, learned counsel for the wife.

These two Transfer Petitions are filed by the husband and the wife for transfer of the respective proceedings, to a convenient Court.

It appears that following the intervention of the Supreme Court Mediation Center, the parties have settled their matrimonial disputes and have signed the Settlement Agreement dated 19.06.2020. Following this, the joint application is filed for disposal of the matrimonial disputes.

Ms. Aruna Gupta, learned counsel appearing for the husband submits that he is ready with a Demand Draft of Rs. 5 Lakhs and the same is being handed over to Ms. Neela Gokhale, learned counsel appearing for the wife.

The receipt of the agreed sum is acknowledged by Ms. Neela Gokhale. But the learned counsel for the wife submits that some additional articles were to be delivered by the husband to the wife and in lieu of those, reasonable sum can additionally be paid by the husband.

Reacting to the above, Ms. Aruna Gupta, learned counsel for the husband submits that no additional sum was payable as per the Settlement Agreement dated 19.06.2020. However, as a gesture of goodwill, the husband will pay further sum of Rs. 36,000/- to the wife, in view of the settlement reached by the parties. It be paid accordingly.

Having recorded the above, the powers under Article 142 of the Constitution is invoked and the marriage between "Parik Pahwa and Aastha Singh" is ordered to be dissolved, by mutual consent. A decree of divorce should, accordingly, be issued. The parties shall abide by the terms and conditions of the Settlement Agreement.

As has been agreed, considering the absence of normal functions of the Court, the FIR No. 543 of 2019 at Police Station Lonikand, Pune registered at the instance of the complainant/wife, is quashed.

The Transfer Petitions are, accordingly, disposed of.
