O R D E R

Heard the learned senior counsel appearing for the parties at length and perused the relevant material.

We are not inclined to interfere with the impugned order passed by the High Court. The special leave petitions are, accordingly, dismissed.

However, learned senior counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners sought one week's time to surrender. Learned senior counsel appearing on behalf of the State of Punjab has no objection in granting one week's time. Accordingly, the petitioners are granted one week's time from today to surrender before the trial Court.

Any observations made by the High Court in the impugned order, does not come in the way of the petitioners in considering the bail applications and the main matters before the trial Court.

As a sequel to the above, pending applications, if any, shall stand disposed of.
