



in the Private self-financing colleges. The Respondents have also challenged the order dated 04.11.2020 passed by the Fee Regulatory Committee for Medical Education in Kerala by which fee was fixed for MBBS course for the academic year 2020-2021. As no guidelines have been framed by the National Medical Commission for fixing the fee structure, the High Court declined to give any direction to the National Medical Commission. Insofar as the order dated 04.11.2020 of the Fee Regulatory Committee is concerned, the High Court set aside the order and directed the Committee to fix the fee in light of the parameters in Section 11 of the 2017 Act and the directions given in the judgment of the High Court in *Jubilee Mission Medical College and Research Institute v. State of Kerala*. The said judgment in *Jubilee Mission* (supra) was subject matter of Civil Appeal Nos. 606-616/2021 which were disposed of by a judgment dated 25.02.2021. In the said judgment, this Court directed the Committee to fix fee in private and self-financing colleges from 2017-2018 till 2020-2021 on the basis of the observations made therein.

In view of the directions issued by this

Court in the judgment dated 25.02.2021, the direction issued by the High Court by its order dated 22.12.2020 to follow the directions issued in *Jubilee Mission* (supra) is set aside.

The Special Leave Petitions are accordingly, disposed of. Pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of.
