"We are not inclined to entertain the Special Leave Petition under Article 136 of the Constitution. The Special Leave Petition is accordingly dismissed.

However, Mr. Salman Khurshid, learned senior counsel submits that having regard to the circumstances which have transpired, the petitioners may move a representation to the competent authority for considering their case for age relaxation in the case of a future recruitment.

The petitioners may do so. We make no observation on the merits of such a representation.
