O R D E R

Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner. This petition is by the wife of the respondent. The petitioner is the resident of Bangalore in the State of Karnataka and the respondent is the resident of the State of Telangana. The respondent has filed a petition for Divorce against the petitioner in the Court of the IInd Addl. Family Court, Judge, RR District, Telangana, Kukatpally. It is pointed out in the Transfer Petition that the travelling distance between the place of residence of the petitioner and the Court in which the Divorce petition is pending is about 650 kilometers which takes more than 14 hours. It is pointed out that it is inconvenient for the petitioner to travel to the said Family Court in the State of Telangana.

Office Report indicates that the service of notice on the respondent is complete, but no one is representing the respondent.

Perused the averments made in this Transfer Petition. Having considered the facts and circumstance of the case, I deem it fit and proper to allow this transfer petition. Accordingly, Matrimonial O.P. Case No. 255 of 2019 titled "Mr. Nagaraju Kunchala vs. Mrs. Shilpa" pending before Court of IInd Addl. Family Court Judge, R.R. District at Kukatpally, Telangana is hereby transferred to the Family Court at Bangalore, Karnataka.

The Transfer Petition is, accordingly, allowed.

Pending applications, if any, shall also stand disposed of.
