UPON hearing counsel the Court made the following
O R D E R

Mr. R. Balasubramonium, learned counsel appearing for the petitioner, has invited our attention to the Recruitment Rules and submitted that there are 20 points awarded for career marks and the split up of career marks is given in Appendix-A to the Recruitment Rules.

It is seen from the Appendix that in case the candidate has passed in 1st Class in +10, +12, +3yrs (degree) and Masters, he is entitled to get 5 marks each.

According to the petitioner, going by any standard, he is entitled to get 15 marks. It is also submitted that there are manipulations in the answer sheets. However, these aspects are

not reflected in the Judgment.

The learned counsel for the petitioner, therefore, seeks permission to withdraw this Special Leave Petition with liberty to file a Review Petition before the High Court.

Permission, as above, is granted.

The Special Leave Petition is, accordingly, dismissed as withdrawn.

We make it clear that in case the review petition is filed before the High Court within thirty days from today, the High Court may consider the same on merits.

We further make it clear that we have not considered the matter on merits.
