UPON hearing the counsel the Court made the following
O R D E R

1. The matter pertains to visitation rights. By the first impugned order dated 31.07.2019, the High Court had granted limited visitation rights to the petitioner and his parents.
2. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner states that though the High Court has given findings in favour of the petitioner and allowed the appeal filed by the petitioner, it has refused to grant any substantial relief to the petitioner.
3. It is also the grievance of the petitioner that even the directions passed by this Court during the pendency of the present matter are not complied with.
4. We are, however, informed that the matter is still pending before the Family Court. In that view of the matter, we find that it will be appropriate that the Family Court at Jaipur is requested to decide the custody proceedings pending before it. In any case, since now the child is seven years old, the learned Family Court at Jaipur would consider granting appropriate visitation rights to the petitioner and his parents. The same shall be done expeditiously and preferably within a period of six weeks from today.
5. The special leave petition is accordingly disposed of.
6. Pending application(s), if any, shall stand disposed of.
