O R D E R

Though a letter was circulated seeking time, there is no justification to adjourn the matter. It is taken up on merits.

This is a transfer petition at the instance of the petitioner-wife seeking transfer of the case bearing M.P.No.86A of 2016 titled *Gajendra Solanki v. Shobha* pending before the Principal Judge, Family Court, Betul, Madhya Pradesh to Family Court at Amravati, Maharashtra.

Considering the hardships which will be faced by the petitioner in contesting the case at Betul, M.P., we deem it proper to allow the transfer petition and direct transfer of the aforesaid case from the Principal Judge, Family Court, Betul, Madhya Pradesh to the Family Court at Amravati, Maharashtra along with all records for its adjudication.

After transfer of the petition, the transferee Court is directed to make all endeavour either for amicable settlement or for early decision in the matter without unnecessary adjournments.

If the respondent-husband seeks leave from the authorities for participating in the proceedings at Amravati, leave shall be
