O R D E R

The contention raised by the petitioner in this special leave petition is that the requirements of the Circular dated 18.01.2005 issued by the Government of India, Ministry of Communication and I.T., Department of Posts read with Postal Manual Volume III - Consultation with Central Vigilance Commissions, has not been complied with by the Department, which, according to him, would vitiate the disciplinary proceedings and also the order passed thereon.

Further, it was submitted that after filing of this special leave petition, the Chief Postmaster General has passed final orders in the disciplinary proceedings on 24.03.2017 imposing

punishment of compulsory retirement with immediate effect.

Having regard to the subsequent development, we are not inclined to entertain this special leave petition. The special leave petition is disposed of giving liberty to the petitioner to raise the points urged in this special leave petition while challenging the impugned order of punishment dated 24.03.2017.
