O R D E R

The Court is convened through Video Conferencing.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioners.

The grievance of the petitioners in the instant petitions is that they are ready and willing to surrender and, for that purpose, they sought a clarification of order dated 09.10.2020 passed by the High Court directing them to surrender before the trial court.

It is the contention of the petitioners that the Division Bench of the High Court, vide order dated 18.12.2020 while modifying the order dated 09.10.2020, directed the petitioners to surrender before the appropriate Sessions Court without considering

the fact that their case is pending before the Court of Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Barrackpore and the case has not been committed to the Sessions.

Having heard learned counsel for the petitioners and carefully perusing the material placed on record, we are not inclined to entertain these petitions seeking clarification of the impugned orders passed by the High Court.

The special leave petitions are, accordingly, dismissed.

As a sequel to the above, pending interlocutory application also stands disposed of.

However, if the petitioners are ready and willing to surrender before the competent court, they are at liberty to do so and thereafter, they can move an application for regular bail before that Court.
