Application preferred by the petitioner seeking discharge under the provisions of Section 239 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973, having been rejected by the Trial Court, Criminal Revision Application No.60 of 2017 was preferred. By judgment under appeal, the challenge was negated by the High Court and the Revision Application was dismissed.

Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner, we do not see any reason to interfere with the order passed by the High Court.

Learned counsel for the petitioner however submits that there are certain observations touching upon the merits of the matter which may prejudice the case of the petitioner in the trial.
